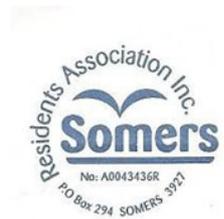


SRA members update June 2019



SRA to offer community cash grants

The SRA will establish a grants program which will make amounts of up to \$500 available to local community groups and organisations. There will be one grant of \$500 and four of \$250 available each year for local not-for-profit organisations. The recipients must show in no more than 150 words why they should receive a grant, how the money will be spent and how it will benefit the community.

SRA President Gerry Lewis said the initiative was part of the SRA's community involvement.

"While we monitor issues that might impact on our community through lobbying and our well-established contacts at the shire, we felt that we needed to do more hence the creation of these grants," he said.

The names of the successful recipients will be announced in November. Details and entry forms will be available in the coming weeks.



New committee members

The SRA welcomes two new committee members to its ranks - Debbie Lever and Liz Charpentier - who will add a new perspective to the association.

Debbie Lever has worked in the music and television industries, IT consulting and now as a trainer and assessor (financial services) for the vocational educational and training (VET) system. She is also a member of the Somers Yacht Club.

Membership extended

The SRA committee has decided to bring the membership year into line with the financial year – July to June. As a result members will get six months free membership.

Putting Somers on the map

The SRA will hold a competition with a prize of \$500 for the design of "Welcome to Somers" signage to be placed on the two roads leading into the village.

The initiative will be open to Somers residents and there will be the major open prize and a special prize for juniors – under 16 years of age.

The entries will be judged by an independent panel of local residents and the winner will be announced in March 2020.

SRA President Gerry Lewis said that the SRA felt it was important to add to the sense of identity that locally-produced signs should welcome visitors to our community.
